What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Betashares Australia 200 Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the Fund with other funds.

The Fund aims to provide an investment return that tracks the performance of the Solactive Australia 200 Index, before taking into account fees and expenses.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Betashares Australia 200 Fund¹



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the Fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Example of how this applies to an investor²

Matthew had \$10,000 in the Fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Matthew received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$681.88 (that is 6.82% of his initial \$10,000). Matthew also paid \$0 in other charges. This gives Matthew a total return after tax of \$539.02 for the year.

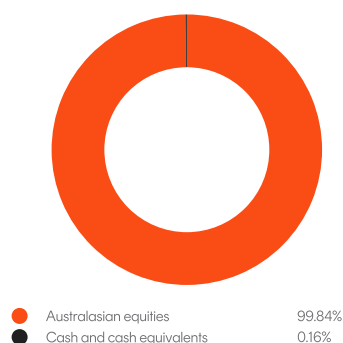
